BECKY KEARNS NAMED HEALTHCARE TRUSTEE OF THE YEAR

October 10, 2011—Becky Kearns, board chair for Park City Medical Center, was recently awarded the Hospital Trustee Service award by UHA, Utah Hospitals and Health Systems Association. The award, presented during the Association’s Fall Leadership Conference at The Park City Marriott, recognizes individuals who have made significant contributions to Utah’s healthcare sector while serving as a community trustee.

Kearns has been a member of the Park City Medical Center’s Board of Trustees since 2003. She has guided the hospital through all phases of its development and has served as the Park City Medical Center board chair since its inception. She also served on the Land Acquisitions Board for the project.

Kearns has also been an effective advocate for Park City Medical Center with the local community. She has led the board through the development of a unique medical staff plan designed to specifically meet the needs of the community while addressing many of the challenges of medical staff development in a resort area. Once the new Park City Medical Center opened, she immediately began the process of molding the development board into an effective operating hospital board.

"The biggest accomplishment was getting the hospital built, and the groundbreaking was probably one of the most moving events I have attended," said Kearns. "When the hospital was finally completed it gave the board and Intermountain Healthcare the opportunity to provide a world class facility that the communities we serve could utilize in their own backyards."

Park City Medical Center offers a host of medical services, including orthopedic, plastic and general surgery, physical therapy, family and internal medicine, labor and delivery services, women's services and cardiac care. The hospital features 26 inpatient rooms, all private and offering spectacular views of the surrounding Wasatch Mountains.

"I look forward to being able to build on the services we provide in response to increased needs in the community," commented Kearns. "This will allow us to stay true to our commitment to the communities--that we will listen to their needs and provide accordingly in order to make all of us proud that this is 'our hospital' and that it is truly world class."

Kearns is a well-respected leader in the Park City area. Professionally, she serves as a Regional President for Zions Bank in Park City. In this

position she has been responsible for building Zion's Resort Banking division. She oversees operations in both the Park City and Sun Valley markets. In addition to her role at Zions, Kearns is actively involved in the Park City business community. She is past president of the Park City Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors and is a member of the Zions Bank Political Action Committee and the Idaho State University Foundation. She also volunteers in an advisory role at the Peace House, the Sundance Film Festival and the Deer Valley Music Festival Council, as well as with other professional and non-profit organizations. Kearns has received several awards for her service and business acumen, including individual and team awards for "Most Powerful Women in Banking" recognition from the American Bankers Association. She was listed as a "Utah Woman of Influence" in 2005. Kearns was also noted in the "25 Women to Watch" listing in 2005 and 2006. At Zions she has been recognized with the 2007 Roy W. Simmons Community Service Award and received Zions Bank's Excellence award in 2003.

Becky and her husband, Keith have two sons and have been married for 26 years. Her personal interests include travel, golfing, skiing and enjoying the outdoors with family.

"I am humbled and extremely honored to have been chosen from so many esteemed trustees throughout the State of Utah," commented Kearns. "I was fortunate to have such a wonderful board over the years that has been the "heart and soul" of all the challenges, including the building of the hospital and working with the communities to accept the hospital. My mother and father engrained in me the importance of being

involved in the community and working to leave it a better place than when you arrived. I am supported by a wonderful husband and two sons who have been there along the way supporting me in this effort."
